What is Assistive Technology?

34

Generic term for devices and modifications that help people overcome or remove barriers created by their disability.

Any device or system that allows a person with a disability to perform a task they would otherwise be unable to do.

Why use Assistive Technology?

- Increase efficiency and/or effectiveness
- Decrease degenerative nature of disability
- Support or replace skills lost or altered by illness, disease or accident
- Avoid injury
- Increase independence


